Our school's cross country event will be held on Wednesday 27th March for which students will be grouped according to age. The schedule is as follows:

BOYS AND GIRLS WILL RUN TOGETHER IN THE 9/10, 11 and 12 YEAR OLD CATEGORY. THE JUNIOR SCHOOL RACES WILL BE SINGLE SEX RACES.

Please note that these times are a guide and we would like to keep the program moving. Events may start marginally earlier or later than the programmed time.

This year the course is similar to 2023 due to construction, however, the course has changed slightly due to Kambrya's construction. The course begins and finishes at Kambrya College (back oval, access via our back gate). We will have Kambrya College students leading all races to ensure our students know where to run.

To increase the atmosphere of the cross country, all classes from Year 3 to 6 will need to be on Kambrya's oval at 9.15. Years Prep to 2 at 11.10 a.m.

The students will running for selection in the school cross -country team (Years 4 to 6). They are also running for their house team. The first 10 runners in each age group receive 20 house points, the next 10 runners receive 15 house points, the next 10 runners receive 10 house points and the remaining runners receive 5 house points.

As the students are running for their house teams, please encourage them to wear appropriate colours, along with suitable footwear.

Through storytelling, traditional singing, chants, instruments and dance from the Solomon Islands, Natty aims to preserve the traditional cultures by sharing knowledge and providing a global experience and perspective unique to Melanesia.




